Hansa Mehta (1897-1995), a reformist, social activist, educator, independence activist, feminist, and writer from India. Widely credited with replacing the phrase in the UDHR "All men are born free and equal" with "All human beings are born free and equal."

Anna Eleanor Roosevelt

(1884-1962) an American diplomat, activist, and first lady from 1933-1945. She was a key member of the US delegation to the United Nations during the two-year process that led to the UDHR adoption in 1948. She also served as Chair of the Human Rights Commission.
